



## WHAT'S THE PROBLEM?

- For decades, Corrales residents have complained of noxious odors and unexplained illnesses. There are concerns about links between emissions from the Intel plant and connection to serious illnesses among residents living in its vicinity.
- CAFA NOW!'s air monitoring has detected alarming levels of harmful chemicals in Corrales.
- Intel regulates itself. There is no independent third-party monitor to evaluate Intel's data regarding emissions or other potential hazards.
- There is no continuous monitoring of the plant's emissions. The New Mexico Environment Department has given Intel free reign to decide what the appropriate safety measures are, rather than forcing them to install the *most effective* emissions abatement equipment to protect residents

## WHAT SHOULD INTEL DO?

The technology exists to keep Corrales safe. Intel can and should take the following measures to ensure public health and safety.

- **MODERNIZE:** Install the best abatement equipment available in the new FAB, and replace all outdated thermal oxidizers and scrubbers in the rest of the facility.
- **MONITOR:** Implement continuous emissions monitoring, overseen by an independent monitor, with data available to the public. Also, Intel should install FTIR monitors to the north and south of the plant that will continuously monitor air quality in the vicinity.

## WHAT CAN YOU DO?

Intel needs to know that the community is concerned, and that the community will hold Intel to account. Here's how you can take action:

- **SIGN THE PETITION.** Ask Intel to do what's right.
- **GET INVOLVED.** Join CAFA NOW! Get involved.
- **TALK TO YOUR NEIGHBORS.** Ask them if they've experienced breathing problems, headaches, or other issues since moving to Corrales, and if they have experienced any strange odors. Let them know that there is more that Intel can do to keep us safe
- **DONATE.** We depend on donations to install air monitoring equipment, host public meetings, and organize. Your support will help us continue gathering crucial data, informing the public, and pushing Intel for change.
